Good afternoon Mayor Olson:

My name is David Khan; I am an engineer with the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation office in Juneau. Part of my duties relates to Log Transfer Facilities in southeast Alaska.

On November 29, 2017, we were contacted by Mr. Tim Chittenden (907.772.5836) of US Forest Service (USFS) regarding a Log Transfer Facility near the City of Coffman Cove. Mr. Chittenden apprised us that by an act of the US Congress, 16 acres of USFS land has already been transferred to the City of Coffman Cove. Additionally, we were informed that a Log Transfer Facility having a general permit AKG700039 lies near/within the City of Coffman Cove, which the USFS does not intend to use anymore and wishes to be transferred to the City of Coffman Cove.

While we have no objection to the idea of transferring Log Transfer Facility (LTF) general permit AKG700039 from USFS to the City of Coffman Cove, we want to make sure that it is ok with the City of Coffman Cove. Please let us know whether you would like the LTF general permit transferred to the City of Coffman Cove or not? If you choose not to have the LTF general permit transferred to Coffman Cove or if we do not hear from you by January 5, 2018, it may be rescinded. In this case, if Coffman Cove needed a LTF general permit in future then Coffman Cove will has to apply fresh.

Please let us know your feedback by January 5, 2018.
